

**Commissioner Meeting
February 7, 2017**

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 10:00 am. Present were Commissioners Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek and Chairman Sand. Others present were Dickey Sargent Joint Water Board Chairman Norman Haak, Moore Engineering Attorney Josh Hassell and Treasurer Gail Veland. The press was not represented.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Additions to the Agenda

Hamar motioned to approve the January 17th minutes. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Simek motioned to approve the vouchers with additions in the amount of \$801.31 for a total of \$269,329.93 and voucher payee name change from Game and Fish to Dickey County. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Norman Haak and Josh Hassell updated the commissioners on the history and progress of the Jackson Drain project. Mr. Hassell reported the ND Department of Transportation (DOT) was responsible to install and pay for the crossings on State Highways 1 and 11. The DOT asked the DCJWRD to install the crossings in order to expedite completion. DSJWD was reimbursed for the cost of installation and materials. He said the work had to be completed before they could request reimbursement, which is why the DSJWRD was short on funds. Hassell will send a more complete bond payment schedule to the auditor's office. He explained to Veland that DSJWRD Secretary Nannette Severson will use a spreadsheet to track the assessment payments.

Clerk of Court Andi Schimke joined the meeting at 10:45 and reported \$103,531.45 of Court Facility Grant money was awarded to pay for 67% of the cost of the roof replacement that is designated as District Court area, in addition to repair of ceiling plaster, walls, and paint the hallway. Schimke said the designated area includes the jury room, judge's chamber and the court recorder's area. Commissioner Hamar thanked Schimke for her extra time and effort to apply for Court Facility Grants over the years.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen, Sheriff Chris Estes, 911/DES Director Charlie Russell, and Kadmas, Lee and Jackson Engineer Josh Loegering joined the meeting at 11:00 AM. Loegering said the roof replacement project could be bid by the end of May, and a completion date can be included in the bid paperwork, Engineering for the project will be approximately \$30,000, which includes construction engineering. Schimke will send a letter of acceptance for the grant.

Loegering presented reimbursement requests for the mine and blend project in the amount of \$1,200.95 from HB 1176 for project CNOC-1112(070) and \$9,768.33 from SB 2103. Simek motioned to pay the reimbursement. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Loegering explained that Department of Transportation (DOT) representative Bryan Fuchs said typically the DOT allows counties to borrow three years ahead on federal aid. Although Fuchs isn't sure the DOT will allow the county to borrow ahead for an overlay on County 2 because of the poor condition of the road. Fuchs suggested the county consider using a new mine and blend process on a portion of County 2. The process is to add lime and cement to good gravel. Loegering said the lime and cement minimize the amount of dust on the road. The project will need to be funded 100% by the county so some environmental studies will not be required. A 2" overlay on the stabilized road base will be completed when federal aid money is available. Loegering encouraged the commission to look at Cass County 9 which has a test site of the above process. The commissioners will schedule a public meeting to get input from the public about repairing Dickey County 2.

Russell expressed concern about potential flooding in Ludden as well as at Pheasant Lake. He isn't sure what entity is responsible for Pheasant Lake. States Attorney Neuharth said NDCC 61-02 describes the Duties of the State Water Commission, which states in part: "... shall have full and complete power and authority...and to supervise all works, dams and projects..."

Road Superintendent Hagen reported the railroad crossing at Fullerton has been approved. The commissioners and Superintendent Hagen discussed different options for a sand salt storage building.

Hagen said the gravel haulers asked to have the gravel hauling bid hearing in March instead of April so if their bid isn't accepted they will have time to negotiate non-county hauling contracts.

Commissioner Roberts motioned to sign the leases for two 2016 JD road graders. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Tax Director Flaherty joined the meeting at Noon to discuss the county wide sales ratios. He said the 2016 ag-land sales ratios are comparably higher than the 2015 ratios, which means the assessed values and actual sales are more in line. This does not affect the assessment of ag land but is useful in understanding ag land sales.

County wide sales ratio for residential property is at 92.2% and commercial property is at 101.7%. Flaherty made a recommendation to the commission for the 2017 assessment. Commissioner Hamar felt Flaherty should keep up with what the county has been doing, stating the high end home values need to be reviewed. Sand suggested Flaherty apply an increase for residential this year so when Vanguard is fully implemented the increase won't so large. Hokana asked Flaherty to use caution because the county doesn't want to get behind. Roberts wants the assessors to be able to make their adjustments, and if they don't make changes the board will have to address it. Discussion followed. The commission requested Flaherty to meet with the major cities and report their feedback to his recommendation at the next meeting at which time a decision will be made.

The board discussed the farm home exemption procedure. Flaherty explained the requirements have always been in place but the county has not always enforced them.

The commission compared the benefit to the cost of membership that Dickey County receives from South Central Dakota Regional Council. They also reviewed notes placed in the Employee Comment Box. Discussion followed about the 911/DES job requirements along with salaries and volunteer pay for ambulance and fire department volunteers. The commission felt volunteer employees are performing a needed service to the county; although they agreed employees should schedule their volunteer times in a manner that is fair to the taxpayers as well.

Hokana motioned to adjourn the meeting at 2:30 pm.

Commission Meeting February 21, 2017

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 10:20 am. Present for the meeting were Commissioners Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Marke Roberts and Chairman Sand. Commissioner Simek was unable to attend. The press not represented.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Additions to the Agenda

2016 Budget Amendments

Lovell Drain Report

Commissioner Roberts motioned to approve the minutes as amended. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Hamar motioned to approve the vouchers. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Hokana motioned to approve the financials as presented. Hamar seconded.

Sheriff Chris Estes joined the meeting at 10:25 am. He said he is discussing truck weight enforcements with the surrounding counties. Roberts motioned to request the ND Highway Patrol's year around assistance with county weight enforcement. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Sheriff Estes said the state of ND is asking for assistance with monitoring the protest site cleanup in Morton County. Estes decided not to send Dickey County officers to assist. He said the ND Bureau of Investigation (BCI) is offering training for emergency volunteers regarding what to watch for in drug procession and the proper handling of the substance.

Tax Director Don Flaherty and Treasurer Gail Veland joined the meeting at 10:30 am. Flaherty said he met with Ellendale and Oakes cities about whether they wanted to increase the residential valuations. He reported both cities feel the current residential value should be left as is.

John Quandt and Steve Hansen joined the meeting at 11:10 to update the commission on the privately owned Lovell Drain and present logistics for the new 113th Avenue

Project. Quandt said the hydrology studies are complete for the project and requested a 24” culvert installation across Dickey County 5.

Hokana motioned to allow a 24” culvert to be installed at the crossing of County Roads 3 and 5 for the benefit of 113th Avenue Project. Hamar seconded. Hagen recommended that Quandt wait to install the culvert until the frost is out of the ground. Motion carried. Discussion followed about the 42” culvert that is installed on County 5. Quandt and Hansen preferred to leave the 36” culvert intact if possible as the larger culvert will operate as a surge for the 24” culvert.

Quandt said there will be changes in the original plan for the Lovell Township drain route because of grassland acres in Sargent County. He said the project will probably be approved at the state level soon, although the state may require control structures to be in place if the water gets too high.

Quandt said the private drain owners are hoping Dickey County will pay a portion of the cost for the drain project because the drain will benefit County Road 14B. The private Lovell Drain owners plan to bring the section of ditch that supports the Lovell Drain up to the correct grade.

Quandt said he wants to make sure the process they used to vacate the township road between Lovell Township and Sargent County is correct. He said the road should be vacated to remove Lovell Township from any liability. States Attorney Neuharth reviewed the ND Century Code and said it appears that with signatures of at least 70% of landowners to agree to vacate the section line would be sufficient. Quandt and Hansen will attend the March 7 commission meeting for further discussion.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen and Kadmas, Lee and Jackson Engineer Josh Loegering joined the meeting at 11:00 and presented the engineering contract for the courthouse roof replacement. He said the contract is \$29,100 which includes bidding the project, design and construction engineering. Loegering said there is money remaining on the preliminary engineering contract as well. He said the contract includes all contact with the ND Historical Society. Hamar motioned to sign the design and engineering contract for the courthouse roof replacement. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Loegering submitted an agreement that allows KLJ to take 8 cores from County Road 2 so they can develop alternatives for repairing the road. Discussion followed about alternatives available for County Road 2. Loegering said KLJ is considering other repair options than the process discussed at the last meeting. Hokana motioned to authorize \$15,000 for KLJ to take 8 road cores from County 2 for inspection purposes. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Hagen and the board discussed getting new bids for the salt sand storage building. They felt there were too many misunderstandings regarding the type and cost of a building which is to be used to store salt sand. The building may be budgeted for the 2018 fiscal year. Hagen said he has the gravel hauling bid set for March 21 and he will place the ad in the newspaper. Commissioner Roberts asked about the ice buildup under the Godfrey Bridge on County 3. Hagen said he is monitoring the problem.

Roberts motioned to adjourn at 1:00 pm. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.
