## **Commission Meeting**

## March 1, 2016

Chairman Sand called the meeting called to order at 10:15 am. Present were John Hokana, Joel Hamar, Dean Simek and Chairman Sand. Commissioner White wasn't able to attend.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Additions to the Agenda

Truck Regulatory vehicle

Dogs in the Court House

Vanguard training

4-H Youth Development Agent

States Attorney joined the meeting at 10:20 am and reported to the Commissioners about a letter he had received from an attorney concerning moving of berms on County Rd 3.

Hamar motioned to approve the minutes with corrections. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar told the Commissioners that he had received complaints of dogs in the court house. He made a motion to have a policy that no pets are allowed in county buildings, other than service animals effective March 1, 2016. Simek seconded the motion. Motion carried. Hamar requested Charlie Russell to order a sign for the Court House and one for the Highway/Social Services building.

Sheriff Chris Estes and 911/DES Coordinator Russell joined the meeting at 10:25 am. Hamar updated the commissioners on the truck regulatory vehicle. Barnes County got the bid for the vehicle, which plans to use the vehicle for zoning. The original letter stated if there were no bids for law enforcement, the vehicle would be stripped and the equipment divided among the parties. Since Dickey County plans to use the vehicle for law enforcement and they had the highest bid for that use, the vehicle will possibly go to Dickey County for the \$6,200.00 that was bid.

Hokana motioned to pay the vouchers with the addition of Montana Dakota Utilities for \$97.34, ND Insurance Department for \$30.00, Dakota Plains Credit Union for \$500.00 and a FEMA payout to German Township of \$57,959.03. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar motioned to open the abatement hearing at 10:35 am. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Present for the hearing was Tax Director Flaherty. The landowner did not attend the hearing. Flaherty explained that SE ¼ -5-129-66 (parcel #01271000) was supposed to be reclassified from cropland to mixed in 2015. The change did not get recorded in the tax system. Hokana motioned to grant the abatement for parcel #01271000. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Flaherty presented the abatement request for W1/2 and SE¼ of NE1/4 -32-130-66 (parcel #02584001) has 7 acres of water that was not accounted for. Hokana motioned to grant the abatement on parcel #02584001. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Simek motioned to close the abatement hearing. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar asked Flaherty if the County had received all the training they were to receive from Vanguard. Flaherty stated there was still some training time that he plans to use for training for himself and Dana Geller.

Sheriff Estes told the commissioners that with all the reporting changes their office is purchasing their own server that will be housed in their office. Estes also stated he will start interviewing for the fourth deputy position in two or three weeks. Interviews may be on Saturday since some of the applicants are still at the academy.

Russell reported on the upcoming need for the burn ban for 2016. With the weather warming up and lack of snow he felt that the Commission needs to put a plan in place. Hokana motioned for the Chairman to sign the Fire Emergency and Burn Plan. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Kadrmas, Lee and Jackson (KLJ) Engineer Loegering, Highway Superintendent Hagen joined the meeting at 11:00 am. Russell presented an Overhead Permit that he and Hagen had put together for height restrictions for equipment coming into the county. The form will need to be revised as the height is currently not on the form. The fee will be \$100.00 per project. Simek made a motion to accept and instate the permit policy with the changes discussed. Hokana seconded. Motion carried. A letter from the highway department along with a copy of the form will be sent to all the Township Clerks and Treasurers so that they could discuss it at the annual township meetings held in March.

Hagen told the commission he had spoken with the ND DOT and they had informed him that load limits will go on March 15<sup>th</sup> as usual, but may go on earlier due to the change in the weather. They also informed Hagen that construction on the bridge on Highway 11 will be done this year. They still plan to do a bypass while the work is being done. Hagen stated that the new gooseneck flatbed trailer is in and he will pick it up this week. The motion to approve bills was revised to include the payment for the trailer. Hagen stated that reflectivity verifications for the county signs are completed.

Loegering stated the mitigation with the landowner for Dickey County #3 has been signed. Loegering stated he will wait for payment and to file the paperwork until the ND Corp of Engineers approve the project. There have been additional costs with KLJ because of the work the Corp has required them to do and Loegering asked the Commissioners to sign an Amendment to Engineer-Owner Agreement in the amount of \$19,000. Hamar motioned to sign the agreement. Simek seconded. Roll call vote Hokana yes, Hamar, yes, Simek yes, Sand yes. Motion carried.

Loegering stated the widening project bid opening date will probably be April 28 or 29<sup>th</sup>. The cost of paving is coming down because of the drop in oil prices. Discussion followed concerning the bidding process. The decision was to bid the widening project and have the mine/blend bidding overlap. The project still is contingent on the Corp approving the project.

Loegering will check on the status of the Energy audit for the repair of the roof that is being completed by KLJ and report at the next meeting.

Park Board Chairman Wertz was called into the meeting at 11:35. Hamar had noticed a spelling error on the new sign at Pheasant Lake. Wertz will contact the company to make corrections on the sign.

Clerk of Court Schimke joined the meeting at 11:45. Her grant has been approved so the security glass can now be installed. The repair of the ceiling in the hallway will have to wait until the roof is fixed. She informed the commissioners that the local court administrator will not sign the city of Fullerton agreement. Schimke has talked to Fullerton City Auditor Haring. Schimke will e-mail Haring the draft that the state provided, along with States Attorney Neuharth and Sheriff Estes so that all can review the agreement.

Chairman Sand stated the county had received a letter from the State of North Dakota concerning the funding for clerk of district court services that the county receives. Hamar made a motion to send a letter stating that the board would elect to continue the funding agreement for the 2017-2019 biennium. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Simek made a motion to approve the raffle permit with no fee for the Ludden Sportsman Club. Hokana seconded. Motion carried

Risk Manager Miller joined the meeting at 11:55 am. Miller was looking to possible purchase AED equipment for the Court House and the Highway building for the next budget year of 2017. She said there is currently refurbished ones available for purchase at a cost savings of \$300 per unit. After discussion, Miller will budget new units in the next budget year.

Hamar informed the Commissioners that interviewing for the 4-H Youth Development Agent is scheduled for March

9<sup>th</sup>.

Hokana motioned to adjourn at 12:15 pm. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

## **Commission Meeting**

## March 15, 2015

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 9:35 am. Present were John Hokana, Gary White, Joel Hamar and Chairman Sand. Dean Simek was not in attendance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Additions to the Agenda

4-H Youth Development Agent Interviews

Hamar motioned to approve the March 1 Commission Meeting minutes with corrections. White seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana motioned to approve the vouchers. White seconded. Motion carried.

White motioned to approve the financial statement. Hokana seconded. Motion carried

Commissioner Hamar reported he sat in on the 4-H Youth Development Agent interviews and stated all were good candidates.

The commissioners discussed the amount of money Dickey County is receiving from the discontinued Truck Regulatory coalition. They will not sign the resolution to disburse the remaining funds until the discrepancy in the amount Dickey County receives is resolved.

Schimke joined the meeting at 10:00 am. She presented a new contract between Dickey County and Fullerton City to patrol Fullerton streets. Hamar motioned to sign the agreement. White seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Veland presented an updated agreement between the county and Dakota Plains Credit Union. Veland explained the agreement had more security measures than the previous one. White motioned to have the Chairman sign the agreement. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana motioned to sign the beer and liquor license for Hays Lodge. White seconded. Motion carried.

Tax Director Flaherty joined the meeting at 10:45 am. Flaherty and the commissioners discussed the reassessment of homes that Flaherty is currently doing. Flaherty said he has been sending notices to the property owners informing them he will be assessing their buildings. He stated the Farm Residence Exemption properties will not be assessed at this time. Sand asked Flaherty if the assessment work Flaherty is currently doing is covered under the township contracts with the county. Flaherty said if the measurements he is verifying coincide with the property cards on file, the service is included. If the property card on file isn't current or is nonexistent an additional fee may be charged. Flaherty and the commission discussed requiring a building permit for new structures or improvements to existing structures, which will assist in keeping updated assessments. A fine would be applied if no permit was requested for new or improvements to existing buildings.

KLJ Engineer Loegering, Highway Superintendent Hagen and DES/911 Director Russell joined the meeting at 11:00 am. Commissioner White left the meeting at 11:00 am.

Loegering recommended the county bid the planned widening project on County 3 separate from the mine and blend project, because the state budget cuts reduced the money to the counties. If enough money is left over from the widening, it can be used for the mine and blend.

Hagen said he received a proposal from Bargen, Inc. in the amount of \$98,708 to crack seal 7.5 miles on County 3 from County 8 to Highway 281. Hokana motioned to allow Hagen to accept the proposal from Bargen, Inc. Hamar seconded. Roll call vote was unanimous. Hokana yes; Hamar yes; Chairman Sand yes.

Russell updated the commissioners on the difference between Federal FEMA and the ND DES in 2011 FEMA large project numbers and the work that was completed. Russell will request a federal mediator before the state closes out large projects.

Sheriff Estes and Russell discussed the possibility of a sheriff's posse. Russell said the posse will be separate from the county and consist of volunteers.

Estes and the commission talked about a universal key for the sheriff that would allow access to all of the offices in the courthouse. Deputy Clerk of Court Miller was also present. No decision was made.

States Attorney Neuharth joined the meeting at 11:55 am to discuss a complaint he received from the Fair Labor Board.

Hamar motioned to sign the letter to the Oakes mayor stating the commissioners have no objection to the city lagoon improvements. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana motioned to adjourn at 12:00 noon. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.
