# Commissioner Meeting August 1, 2017

Chairman Thor Sand called the meeting to order at 9:40 am. Roll call with Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, and Chairman Sand present. Commissioner Dean Simek was unable to attend. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Amend bank motion from July 18, 2017 minutes

Hamar motioned to approve the minutes with changes from July 18, 2017. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana made a motion to approve the vouchers, with the addition of Southeast Water Users of \$50.88 and ND Dept. of Emergency Services FEMA payback of \$1,463.86. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Roberts gave an update on the quarterly meeting for South Central Dakota Regional Council. A suggestion was made to request for a grant for repairs on the Court House basement floor under an urgent cause grant. Auditor Sheppard will get more information about the application process.

Chairman Sand gave an update on the county Job Development Authority. There were two proposals brought before the board. A grant was given to OPERA Inc. in the amount of \$7,800 to assist in paying for grant research and writing to get the building updated so that space in the building could be used. The county is matching the funds given by the Ellendale Job Development Authority. The second proposal was tabled, as they did not have a lead lender. They also needed to present to the Ellendale JDA before they come to the county JDA.

DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell joined the meeting at 10:20.

Sheppard presented a permit application from the Hole-in-One Foundation for a raffle at the Oakes Country Club on August 19<sup>th</sup>. The raffle proceeds will go to allocate money to those in need of relief of financial burdens due to a life changing event. The prizes are four guns with a value of \$1,408. Roberts made a motion to approve the application and waive the fee, Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Russell requested the Commission review the drought resolution he presented to them. This will not bring in federal funding, but is being requested by Governor Burgum that all counties sign. The effect of the signed resolutions could eliminate the hiring freeze in the FSA and USDA offices so they can get additional administrative to help the public to do the paperwork. Hokana motioned to sign the declaration. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Commission asked Russell about the FEMA payback that was approved with the bills earlier in the amount of \$1,463.86. Russell stated the township should be billed for the overpayment.

Director of Jamestown Community Corrections Dell Horn, Clerk of Court Andi Schimke, and State's Attorney Administrative Assistant Holly Hokana joined the meeting at 10:30.

Horn presented the contract for administration of community service for 2018. There is an increase because of increases in cost of living. Schimke questioned if we could get a quote for a per occurrence charge, as the services are not used to the extent that she felt the contract amount warranted. Discussion followed concerning the cause in the drop of numbers. Horn stated that the numbers are down in all the different counties that he works in. Some counties administer their own community service, and have gotten grant money for startup costs, but there currently is none available for the next biennium. Horn will put together a new contact with a per case charge, with travel to court dates and no travel. Horn will return August 15<sup>th</sup>.

Horn presented another proposal, which would be in lieu of jail time. It is called T4C (Thinking for a Change). The program is an alternative sentencing option that would lower the tendency of repeat offenders. It would be group meetings the offenders would attend twice a week for 12 weeks that were ordered by the Judge, instead of completing jail time. The meetings would be held in Jamestown. They would charge the individual \$5 and the county would pay \$55 for each session attended. This would be

different from the community service contract discussed earlier. Roberts made a motion to accept the T4C program as presented at the \$55.00 per session cost to the county starting January 1, 2018. Hokana seconded. Motion carried. Horn will meet with the individual judges so that they know it is available for them to use.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 10:50. Kadrmas Lee and Jackson engineer Josh Loegering jointed the meeting at 11:08. Treasurer Gail Veland joined the meeting at 11:20.

Darrell Schrum and Darci Wolff joined the meeting at 11:50 am. The city of Forbes is requesting law enforcement support for ordinance enforcement. They are not necessarily looking for a regular patrol car. Neuharth stated that the sheriff can't enforce criminal laws that are city ordinances. Neuharth stated that civil nuisance complaint may be the only route at this time.

Engineer Loegering stated that some of the drains on the court house roof had to be moved. Nothing has been said about this change requiring a change in the completion date.

Loegering stated that there is an issue with Dickey County 3 west of Oakes, because it is starting to ripple closer to Oakes. We may need to look at chip sealing that road again. No information has been received from Knife River as to a start date for County Road 2. Loegering also stated there was an article in the Grand Forks Herald stating that counties should not expect any funding for next 10 years for road projects. Loegering strongly suggested the Commission budget for chip seal of 5 miles a year at a minimum so that roads can be kept up. Cost of chip seal is approximately \$30,000 a mile.

Highway Superintendent Hagen stated that graveling is almost complete for this year. Hagen stated he is still looking for a worker for the highway department and is not having any luck.

Tax Director Don Flaherty joined the meeting at 12:20.

Treasurer Veland requested that the motion from the meeting of July 18<sup>th</sup> be amended. Roberts made a motion to amend the motion from July 18<sup>th</sup> to not include the Clerk of Courts checking account, which have signatures for Andi Schimke, Cresta Miller, Gail Veland, and Cheryl Brokaw. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Tax Director Flaherty stated the deadline for training for all assessors ended July 31st. Any assessors that had not completed their training will receive a letter stating they are no longer eligible to assess. Flaherty stated that he has approximately 87 parcels that not completed. Flaherty has located an additional person that could help with the completion of the 87 parcels. The individual is a certified assessor and is willing to assist at a cost of \$20.00 per hour plus mileage. Flaherty will speak with townships concerning the completion of these parcels. Flaherty will come back to discuss the plan he is proposing at the next meeting. Flaherty is also going to check with Rod Rodningen if he is interesting in helping out as well. Roberts made a motion to authorize Flaherty to contract the assessors for 200 hours at \$20.00 per hour. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting was recessed at 1:10 and reconvened at 2:00.

Commissioners tabled the appointment of a delegate for the NDACo convention in October until the next meeting.

After budget reviews are completed, Auditor Sheppard will include on the agenda a visit from one of the offices in the Court House each month.

A discussion concerning the individual meetings the commissioners had with all department heads. Each commissioner reported on suggestions made during their meetings.

Sheppard and Chairman Sand will work on the salary scale before the next meeting. A meeting to review budgets for 2018 is set for 9:00 am on August 8<sup>th</sup> in the Commissioner Room.

Hokana motioned to adjourn at 4:00 pm.

#### August 15, 2017

### **Commissioner Meeting**

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 9:30. Roll call with Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek, and Chairman Thor Sand were present. Fair Board Chairman Kacey Holm was also present.

Casey Holm presented the fair budget. Auditor Sheppard will talk with Fair Treasurer Kelly Schmidt to get the changes in revenue for 2017. There was a discussion concerning the beer gardens but no decision was made.

Deputy Treasurer Cheryl Brokaw joined the meeting at 10:20.

Hokana made a motion to approve the minutes for August 1st meeting with changes and the August 8th meeting minutes. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar motioned to approve the vouchers with the additions of Montana Dakota Utilities and Dakota Valley Electric in the amount of \$856.70. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Roberts motioned to approve the financials. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Sheppard informed the Commissioners that the weed board has made a motion to purchase a copier for the weed board building. The Commissioners agreed to allow them use of the small copier that we have in the Commissioner Room. Sheppard will notify them.

Greg Richter joined the meeting at 10:50. Richter is requesting the Commissioners have the ditch at the corner of 82nd Street and 86th Avenue on the south side of the road. The legal description is the NW1/4 of Section 29-132-63. This drain is in the county right of way and was not approved by the Commissioners. Simek made a motion to have the State's attorney draft a letter to the legal owner requiring them to return to ditch to the original state within 30 days. If not done within the time frame, the county will fix it and charge the land owner for the cost. Hamar seconded. Motion carried. Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen, Kadrmas Lee and Jackson Engineer Josh Loegerung, Social Services Director Angie Rall, and Custodians Ray and Scott Peterson joined the meeting at 11:05.

Loegering stated that the roof is completed other than the drain pipe. The sheet rock company will be here tomorrow. The drain pipe should be finished by end of week. There have been issues with the plumbers and the electrician. However they have until September 1st and that the issue with the plumbers. The issue is for the general contractor. Chad's Electric had to come in to fix a problem caused by the electrician and that bill should go to the general contractor. The hole required to be made in the basement wall will be fire proofed and sheet rocked so the area can still be accessed. Loegering stated the county meeting with the ND Department of Transportation meeting is set for Tuesday afternoon October 10th at 4:00 p.m. Simek will attend the meeting.

Director of Jamestown Community Corrections Dell Horn and Clerk of Court Andi Schimke joined the meeting at 11:15.

Superintendent Hagen stated they brought back the old truck that wasn't working back from Oakes and plan to use it for parts.

Director Rall asked for an appointment to the South Central Human Services board. Roberts made a motion to appoint Jim Billey to the board. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Tax Director Don Flaherty joined the meeting at 11:30. State's Attorney Gary Neuharth and Administrative Assistant Holly Hokana joined the meeting at 11:45

Director Horn presented a quote to continue their contract for 2018 at a per case basis. It will be based on a per order basis. The contract was submitted to the Commission is at a cost of \$175 per case. Schimke feels the quote is fair. A separate quote was presented where Horn would come to court 9 times during the year, which would also include a flat charge of \$1,500 a year. Roberts made a motion to sign the agreement with the cost of \$175 per case charge. Hokana seconded. Motion carried. The meeting was recessed at 12:25 and reconvened at 12:50.

Hamar was contacted by Ron Wiederholt from NDSU Extension concerning the SBARE meeting tomorrow in Jamestown. Hamar will attend.

Simek agreed to represent the county at the North Dakota Association of Counties. Simek and Roberts will be attending.

Dickey County is the host for the October meeting of the 5 County Meeting. The meeting would usually be held on October 5th. Sheppard will check with the Angry Beaver and also check with other counties about items for the agenda. Hamar suggested that a training class concerning the Base 1 stabilizer could be an option. Sheppard will contact Loegering about this.

Sheppard brought a request before the Commission to change the signature card for the Dickey County 4-H Council checking account. Simek made a motion to change the signature cards at Starion Financial for the 4-H Council account. Starion Bank should remove Beverly Kuska from the account and the allowed signatures should be Shirlene Wagner, Treasurer, along with a signature from Wanda Sheppard, County Auditor or Stormy Bertsch, Deputy Auditor. It is the policy of the County of Dickey to require 2 signatures. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

A letter was reviewed that the Commissioners received from the prior Weed Board Secretary. State's Attorney Gary Neuharth will update the secretary on the status of training for the weed board.

4-H Agent Aimee Ellinger joined the meeting at 1:30 and gave an update on the activities of the Extension office. Things are going well and are well attended. Hamar asked Ellinger about opportunities to work with kids, if she were to be hired full time.

Salaries were discussed and no decision was made.

A meeting was set for August 22nd at 9:00 am to review budgets and discuss salaries. Simek motioned to adjourn at 3:10.

### **Special Budget Meeting**

### August 22, 2017

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 9:02 Roll call with Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek, and Chairman Sand were present. Also present were Deputy Auditor Stormy Bertsch and Treasurer Gail Veland. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

County Agent Breana Kiser joined the meeting at 9:05 to review the budgets for the County Agent, Extension Fund, and the 4-H Agent budgets. Kiser informed Commissioner that state employees are on a three year salary freeze. Commissioners discussed a need for a full time 4-H Youth Development Agent.

Joint Water Board Chairman Norman Haak and Moore Engineering Engineer Josh Hassell joined the meeting at 10:00 to review the Joint Water Board and Joint Water Board bond budgets. Hassell reported that final payouts are finalized on the project. Hassell presented a breakdown of all the costs for the whole project, showing a cost to the county of \$47,264.48 for section line crossings. This payment will go to pay back the bond. Discussion followed as to which budget that was going to be paid from. 2018 consists mostly of maintenance and a reassessment to correct and adjust the assessments for the bond pay off. Hassell stated that the State Health Department has been pleased with the water quality testing. The agreement with the contractor included a one year warranty, which would cover any repairs that may come up in the first year. At the August 21st meeting, an agreement with General Irrigation was signed to prepay \$17,000 for the maintenance on the pumps for the next three years. The Joint Water Board will need to discuss in the next month or so if they plan to call bonds and pay them off early in 2018.

The meeting went into recess at 10:45 and returned at 10:55.

The Commissioners had a discussion concerning salaries. Social Services Director Angie Rall joined the meeting at 11:40 to discuss the administrative assistant 1 responsibilities. Discussion included changing the timing of increases on new hires to anniversary date. No decision was made.

The meeting went into recess for lunch at 12:15 and reconvened at 12:40.

The State's Attorney budget was reviewed.

Road Supervisor Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 1:15. Roberts made a motion to allow Hagen to hire an equipment operator at \$38,678 on the current scale. As a stipulation of this employment and If the person doesn't have a CDL, they would have three months in order to complete that certification. Upon completion of that certification, salary could be adjusted to the new scale. Simek seconded. Motion carried.
