Dickey County 2 Bid Hearing

Commissioner Joel Hamar opened the bid hearing at 10:00 am. Present were Kadrmas Lee and Jacksion Engineer Josh Loegering, Road Superintendent Jeff Hagen, Commissioner Joel Hamar and bidders Clare E. Kapphaln, Knife River; Perry Marcus , Mark Sand and Gravel; Francis Busse, Mayo Construction Co., Inc.; and Mike Cavanaugh, Central Specialties. Also present was Deputy Auditor Wanda Sheppard.

The following five bids were received.

 Knife River Construction \$1,124,626.40

The bid paperwork will be reviewed by Kadrmas, Lee and Jackson engineers and the commission will determine the lowest responsible bidder during the June 6 Commission meeting.

Hamar closed the bid hearing at 10:09 AM.

Commission Meeting

June 6, 2017

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Present were Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Dean Simek, and Chairman Sand. Commissioner Marke Roberts was unable to due to other commitments. Deputy Auditor Wanda Sheppard was also in attendance.

Richter Ditch

Chairman Sand reported that Casey Holm form the County Fair Board informed him the Fair Board will be borrowing money for more shade to the grandstand. Sand also expressed concerns about Avera Clinic and Emergency Room lack of coverage with Sanford Insurance.

Hamar motioned to approve the minutes. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Simek motioned to approve the financials except the invoice from Oakes Hospital until further information is available. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

The commissioners reviewed the salary schedules for the Road and Sheriff departments. No action was taken at this time.

Tax Director Flaherty distributed the Commercial, Residential and Agricultural Adjustment Worksheet that will be discussed at the County Equalization Meeting on June 8th. Flaherty explained that the large commercial increase in Oakes are due in part because of new construction of the Dollar General and Casey's Gas Station.

DES/911 Director Charlie Russell joined the meeting at 10:30. He submitted the Fire Emergency and Burn Ban for the Chairman to sign. Hokana motioned to implement the burn ban presented by Russell. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Russell reported the lawsuit with ND FEMA is being handled by North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund.

Kadrmas, Lee and Jackson (KLJ) Engineer Josh Loegering joined the meeting at 10:45 to discuss the courthouse roof project. ICS, Inc., Grand Forks, ND was the only bidder on the project with a bid of \$323,600, which is \$125,000 over the engineer's estimate. The bid does not include mechanical which involves the roof drains. Loegering said the bid was higher because the roof core revealed the original roof layer has hazardous material that requires specific techniques to remove and dispose of the material. Hokana motioned for Loegering to have ICS, Inc. contract

with a plumber to install the roof drains. Hamar seconded. Motion carried. Loegering said the parking lot will probably be closed during the time the roof is being replaced.

Loegering presented the contract from Knife River Materials for Dickey County 2. Hamar motioned to accept the bid for Dickey County 2. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hagen presented a photo and a landowner's request to plant trees 60 feet from the center of 88th St. SE. Simek motioned to grant the variance because the existing trees have not caused problems, and with the stipulation that if the county superintendent determines the trees cause road blocking issues, the problem will be resolved at the expense of the landowner. The solution may result in the trees being removed. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Greg Richter joined the meeting at 11:30. Hamar showed him the photos he and Road Superintendent Hagen had recently taken of the drain that Richter reported is backing up into his field. Richter said he has filed a complaint with the County Water Board although he has not received an answer to date. States Attorney Gary Neuharth joined the meeting at noon. He said the Water Board is responsible to determine if the drain is legal. Neuharth reported the party who destroyed the ditch can be held accountable and told to return the ditch to the original condition. The county can also repair the ditch and bill the individual or add the cost to his land taxes. The commission informed Neuharth the County Recorder has no easement on record so the assumption is the easement is 66 feet from the center of the road. Chairman Sand asked Richter if he has older aerial photos of the location to compare with the current ones to see how the ditch has changed.

Sheriff Estes joined the meeting at 11:40. He explained the county has an agreement with the Oakes Police Department to pay for blood and urine collections sent to the State Attorney General Office. The Police Department took four suspects to the Oakes Hospital to test blood and urine and the county received the hospital bill in the amount of \$1,469. Estes said the cost thru the Attorney General Office for urine testing is \$35 to \$40 and blood testing is around \$50. Neuharth said three of the four defendants posted restitution which includes the cost of the tests.

Hokana motioned to include the Oakes Hospital bill with the voucher payments and Sheriff Estes will educate the Oakes City Police Department on the correct procedure for blood draws. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana motioned to close the Dickey County offices and departments on July 3rd and 4th, 2017 in observance of Independence Day. The July commissioner meetings will be held on July 11th and the 18th. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Sand closed the meeting at 12:40.

2017 County Equalization Meeting

June 8, 2017

Chairman Sand called the Tax Equalization meeting to order at 1:00 pm. Present were Commissioners Joel Hamar, Dean Simek, Thor Sand, and Marke Roberts. Commissioner John Hokana was unable to attend. Also in attendance were Tax Director Don Flaherty, Deputy Tax Director Dana Geller, Oakes City Assessor Rod Rodningen, Treasurer Gail Veland, and Deputy Treasurer Cheryl Brokaw.

Commissioner Simek made a motion to open the County Equalization meeting. Hamar seconded. Motion carried

Flaherty submitted paperwork that shows the values change for the cities in Dickey County. The current residential value is 131,690,842 and with adjustments for increases and decreases, the sales ratio is 92.2%. This brings our county wide market value ratio on residential to 93.3% which is within the limits placed by the state. Based on this information, Flaherty recommended to the assessors to leave the residential values the same, unless there was high end residences that needed to be changed because they were undervalued. Ellendale's ratio is at 90.9%, Oakes' ratio is 89.3, and the other small cities' ratio is 104.2%. The total percentage is the concern of the state and we are currently in compliance based on these numbers.

The county commercial value is 96,304,305 with a sales ratio 101.7%, and after adjustments the market valuation is at 97.4%. Flaherty recommended to the assessors to lower

all commercial by 5% to get us into compliance with the state. This would not include twenty properties that will be assessed in 2018 by Vanguard. Those were not touched because they feel the 20 properties are already undervalued. Ellendale is currently at 103.3%, Oakes at 95.6%, and all small cities at 99.5%. For county wide, we are in compliance and therefore Flaherty is recommending to not make any further changes.

Roberts made a motion to approve the decrease in commercial values by 5% and to leave the residential values for the cities the same. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting recessed at 1:05 and returned at 1:15 for the township equalization discussion.

Flaherty submitted paperwork that shows the values change for the townships in Dickey County. As stated with cities, Flaherty had recommended to the assessors to leave the residential values and to decrease the commercial values by 5%, which was the same as recommended for cities. In the area of agricultural land, the sate value per acre is \$823.89, which is a reduction of approximately 1% over last year. After a discussion with the Commissioners, a decision was made to have no change in the agricultural value for 2017. We are in compliance as we are at 94.3%, which is within the boundaries of placed by the state. Hamar made a motion to not make a change in agricultural land for 2017. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Simek made a motion to approve no changes in residential value and the decrease of 5% in commercial in the townships. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Simek motioned to adjourn at 1:25.

County Commissioner Special meeting

June 8, 2017

Chairman Sand called the special meeting to order at 1:25 pm. Present for the meeting were Chairman Thor Sand, Commissioners Marke Roberts, Dean Simek, and Joel Hamar.

Deputy Auditor Sheppard presented an application for a permit to sell raffle tickets from the Ellendale Country Club. Hamar stated the purpose for the funds from the raffle are to raise green number three, which goes under water every year. Hamar made a motion to approve the application and waive the fee. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Hamar stated he had a discussion with them, reminding them that there would not have been a special meeting called just to approve a permit.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30.

Commission Meeting

June 20, 2017

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Present were Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Dean Simek, Marke Roberts and Chairman Sand. Deputy Auditor Wanda Sheppard was also present.

Additions to the Agenda

Review Gravel Roads

Simek motioned to approve the June 6th Commission Meeting minutes, the June 8th County Equalization Meeting minutes and the June 8th Special Meeting minutes

Hokana stated the assessors of the townships and cities should be strongly encouraged to attend the County Equalization Meetings to answer questions from the residents of the townships they assess. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana motioned to approve the vouchers. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Gail Veland and Clerk of District Court Andi Schimke joined the meeting at 9:46.

Hokana motioned to approve the financial statements. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Veland presented a list of checks that have been outstanding for one year and asked the commission to cancel the warrants. She explained the cancelled warrants are kept for another year and then the money is sent to the state as Unclaimed Property. Hamar motioned to cancel the outstanding warrants as presented. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Schimke reported the new passport equipment doesn't work with the lights in their office. The older system worked because they could tweak the lighting of the camera and the new camera doesn't have that option. The new system is a combined unit that has the printer networked with the camera. Andi will see if there is an improvement with using LED lights. She said they have put many hours in trying to improve the photos. Schimke called the vender to ask if she can return the system. He will take it back however Schimke will continue to try and resolve the problem. She feels if the photos aren't acceptable her office prefers to send the people to Aberdeen for their photo and passbook application.

Sheriff Estes and Risk Manager Cresta Miller attended the meeting at 10:15. Miller presented copies of checks the county received in the amount of \$3,400. The checks are for safety trainings and videos that Miller coordinates to reduce the chance of work related accidents.

Sheriff Estes talked about the sheriff office using a fingerprint scanner. He said Dickey Rural came in to update and add cameras in the courthouse. Chairman Sand asked Estes why the vehicles were being serviced at Lusts in Aberdeen instead of locally. Estes said the recall work for the Ford and Chrysler vehicles can't be done locally. Estes said he is interviewing two applicants for Sheriff Deputy and asked if a commissioner is willing to sit in on the interviews.

States Attorney Gary Neuharth and 911/DES Director Charlie Russell joined the meeting at 10:38. County Recorder Deb Anderson was also in attendance. Neuharth said he was informed of disturbing comments made about Weed Board Secretary Deb Anderson. He stated that Deb contacts him often to ask questions about duties of the Weed Board Secretary as well as duties of the Recorder. He noted the actions that Deb told the board should be done different probably came from him. Neuharth further stated that through his private attorney business he brings documents to the Recorder's Office. Deb looks them over and sometimes makes suggestions for changes to the document. He is never is insulted or upset because he feels it's an example of her making sure that all documents meet the requirements of her office. He said she does her job very well

Neuharth asked the commission to go into Executive Session to discuss the possibilities of the county getting sued for discriminatory remarks, recorded on the tape of the May 25th meeting of the Weed Board. Hamar motioned to go into Executive Session at 10:45 am. Roberts seconded. Motion carried. Executive Session ended at 11:12 am

Chairman Sand reconvened the regular meeting. No decisions were made during the Executive Session.

NextEra Energy representatives Ashley Nasby, Clay Cameron, Austin Paxson, Jacob Wise, Daryl Hart, Jamie Gentile, Jeff Beyer, District 28 Representative Mike Brandenburg and Scott Musland joined the meeting at 11:12. Project Manager Nasby updated the commission on the progress of the wind tower project near Merricourt. She said Native Americans are involved in the survey and the Tribes, including Standing Rock, are all OK with the project. Nasby explained that an independent firm has been hired to do the traditional cultural properties survey and the firm has hired Tribal Members to assist with the survey. She also said the landowners are very supportive.

Commissioner Hokana asked for a brief timeframe of the process. Nasby said NextEra is working with Xcel Energy in preparing the initial application process that will be sent to the PSC. The PSC hearing will be held locally in August. At the end of 2017 the project will be turned over to Xcel Energy to own and construct the towers.

Commissioner Hamar asked Representative Brandenburg about the road money that Governor Burgum took out of the former governor's budget. Brandenburg's opinion is there will be no vetoes of the budgets changes.

After reviewing the tape of the Weed Board meeting as a follow up to the first executive session, States Attorney Neuharth asked the commissioners to go into Executive Session. Roberts motioned to go into Executive Session at 11:39. Hamar seconded. Executive Session ended at 12:34 pm.

The regular commission meeting was reconvened at 12:34 pm. Commissioner Roberts motioned to terminate Jerry Rekow from the Dickey County Weed Board, Simek seconded. Motion carried. Discussion is included in the previous recorded session.

Hamar motioned to require the board members present at the Dickey County Weed Board Meeting on May 25, 2017 be required to take discrimination training that will be provided by Dickey County. The board members not present are strongly encouraged to take the training. Roberts seconded. Discussion was included in the previous recorded session. Motion carried.

KLJ Engineer Josh Loegering, Road Superintendent Jeff Hagen and 911/DES Director Charlie Russell joined the meeting at 12:38 Loegering presented an amendment to the engineering contract for County Road. The two prior agreements equaled \$128,700 and the adjusted agreement amount is \$145,400. Loegering said the final amended agreement will be paid on an hourly basis instead of a lump sum amount from this point forward. Simek motioned to accept the amendment to the engineering contract. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Loegering delivered the Standard Form of Agreement between Owner and Contractor for construction on Dickey County 2 along with The Notice of Procedure allowing Knife River to begin construction on County Road 2. Hamar motioned to have the Chairman sign the official Notice to Proceed and allow Knife River to start work on County 2 as soon as they get the Notice. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Special Commissioner meeting

June 30, 2017

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 11:00 am. Present were Commissioners Marke Roberts, Dean Simek, and Chairman Thor Sand. Commissioner Hamar and Commissioner Hokana were unable to attend. Also in attendance were KLJ Engineer Josh Loegering and Custodian Scott Peterson. Pledge of allegiance was recited. Loegering presented the Change proposal on the roof project. The contractor would like to start July 17th, with actual construction to start July 24th. The change proposal included the bid for mechanical and electrical work not submitted on the first bit, which is an increase of \$64,650. Loegering had several meetings with the contractor concerning the amount and feels that the quote is within reason for the work that needs to be completed. The contractor is required to keep the main entrance open for business and to mitigate the dust. Roberts motioned to proceed with the change proposal and the project. Simek seconded. Custodian Ray Peterson joined the meeting at 11:15. Peterson feels the building is in sound condition, but would like contractor to look at the entry way, which is not draining correction. Loegering stated they could look at that during the construction meeting. Roll call vote unanimous with Roberts yes, Simek yes, Sand yes.

Simek motioned to adjourn at 11:30. Meeting adjourned.
